TO: Owners and operators of gasoline transport trucks:

The Air Pollution Control Division (APCD) has recently gone through a process change to improve how the Tank Truck certification program is managed. Please read below for important information which will impact how you apply for your certification.

As of June 1, 2018, APCD will no longer consider the Method 27 form an application for certification. All owners or operators of gasoline transport trucks will now be required to fill out an online application which can be accessed via the state website:

A copy of your Method 27 form will be required as an attachment along with the application. If the Method 27 form is not included, your application will be considered incomplete and cannot be processed.

Upon receipt of an application for certification that meets the requirements, the Division will mail you a sticker and a letter of certification as well as email a copy of your certification letter to the email provided on the application.

APCD will contact you directly if the Method 27 form is incomplete or missing information. Once a corrected form has been obtained you will be required to submit a new application to request certification.

Please keep in mind that you are required to maintain a current copy of the Method 27 test report and State Certification and be able to provide them to an APCD inspector upon request.
